Whereas, long denied the opportunity to participate in competitive sports, women have enthusiastically taken advantage of every sports opportunity offered them; and

Whereas, the tremendous popularity of women's athletics at the collegiate level encourages younger girls to participate in athletics and enhances their self-esteem; and

*Whereas*, the University of Minnesota women's hockey team participated in the 2004 NCAA Women's Frozen Four tournament in Providence, Rhode Island; and

Whereas, they defeated Harvard 6-2 in the final game of the tournament to win the NCAA championship; and

*Whereas*, the Gophers finished the season with an outstanding 30-4-2 record, and have been invited to the White House to meet the President; *Now, Therefore*,
